Dr. Roger Cleveland is known for his educational insight in areas such as diversity, instructional equity, cultural competency, closing achievement gaps, learning styles, transforming school culture, conducting culture audits, and school

improvement planning. He has provided staff development and workshops for a number of schools, districts, social service agencies, state educational agencies and universities. Dr. Cleveland received his Bachelor's Degree at Morehead State University, his Master's Degree at Union College and completed his doctoral work at The University of Cincinnati. Cleveland was the Director of the Division of Federal Programs & Instructional Equity at Kentucky Department of Education, prior to joining the faculty at Morehead State University.

In the Spring 2012, Cleveland received the Professor of the Year Award sponsored by the Kentucky Association of Blacks in Higher Education and was recognized as "Teachers Making A Difference at Eastern Kentucky University." Governor Beshear recently appointed Dr. Cleveland to the State School Curriculum, Assessment & Accountability Council. In March 2013, Cleveland received the P.G. Peoples Award from the Fayette County Public Schools Board of Education for addressing equity and diversity in schools. Dr. Cleveland is currently an Associate Professor in the College of Education at Eastern Kentucky University.



Dr. Ruth Dohner has been a professor at The Ohio State for 34 years. Her goal of FCS programs is to strengthen individuals, build strong families, to nourish strong communities and members of the workforce. Her recent academic

work has been to develop standards for students in the Ohio Family and Consumer Science secondary programs. This includes inquiry projects to assist students to successfully transition at educational points from middle to high school and from high school to post-secondary education. Dr. Dohner's current work is to develop healthy food and lifestyle secondary courses and to prepare FCS teachers in educating middle and high school students to lead environmentally sustainable and healthy lives.



Jorge Arias is the director of international projects for Alltech. He focuses on the Alltech Sustainable Haiti/Alltech Café Citadelle projects, which differentiates between charity and investing in sustainability. Not only

with the Haiti coffee project but also the local fish production.

Norma Taylor, with "edible" magazine, is based out of Louisville and promotes local food systems. The magazine won the 2011 James Beard Foundation Publication of the Year Award.
